TOBACCO-FREE COALITIONS

THE PARTNERSHIP HOUSES THREE MISSISSIPPI TOBACCO FREE COALITIONS WITHIN OUR ORGANIZATION. THESE COALITIONS ARE MADE UP OF MEMBERS ACROSS 9 COUNTIES IN THE STATE. FUNDED THROUGH THE MISSISSIPPI STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH OFFICE OF TOBACCO CONTROL, THE COALITIONS PARTNER WITH SCHOOLS, FAITH-BASED AND COMMUNITY SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS, BUSINESSES AND CIVIC ORGANIZATIONS, AND A NUMBER OF HEALTH ADVOCACY ORGANIZATIONS TO PROVIDE EDUCATION AND RESOURCES TO THE COMMUNITIES THAT THEY SERVE.








SMOKE FREE AIR MAP

GOVERNMENT RELATIONS

THE PARTNERSHIP HAS HAD A STELLAR TRACK RECORD FOR BEING ON THE FRONT LINES OF HEALTH AND WELLNESS POLICIES IN THE STATE. OUR WORK ON THE STATE AND LOCAL LEVELS OVER THE YEARS HAS LED TO POSITIVE CHANGES WITH TOBACCO CONTROL, FOOD ACCESS, FARM TO SCHOOL AND INFANT CARE. WE LOOK FORWARD TO CONTINUING THIS WORK FOR YEARS TO COME.

OVER THE YEARS, LEADING UP TO THE TWENTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF THE PARTNERSHIP, WE HAVE ADVOCATED FOR COUNTLESS TOBACCO CONTROL POLICIES TO PROTECT MISSISSIPPIANS FROM THE RAVAGES OF TOBACCO USE; MANY OF WHICH ARE LAWS THAT HAVE LED TO IMMENSE HEALTH CARE COST SAVINGS FOR THE STATE.

From leading the way to the first comprehensive smoke-free community in Metcalfe in 2002 to the first smoke-free vehicles policy in McComb in 2016, these pioneering policies are setting the tone for other municipalities to adopt similar ordinances. To date there are 142 local, smoke-free ordinances across the state. These are direct reflections of our work and our partners like the Mississippi State Department of Health Office of Tobacco Control and all of the Mississippi Tobacco

Over the past year, The Partnership is helping to fill the void of lack of access to healthy and affordable foods in several communities across the state. We helped establish and enhance farmer's markets across the state through a grant from the Mississippi State Department of Health. The communities we served were Coldwater, Charleston, Moorhead and Utica and we will extend to other communities in 2018.

FARMERS MARKETS



The Partnership worked in four communities with municipal leaders and residents in 2017 to establish and enhance farmers markets operations through marketing, advertising and technical assistance with the goal of increasing access to healthy, affordable, and nutritious foods.

The towns are geographically situated in food deserts from southwest Hinds County to the heart of the Mississippi Delta, namely, Utica, Coldwater, Charleston and Moorhead. Since the inception of the farmers market promotional assistance program, communities have been enriched and excited about the resources being provided through this initiative.

HEALTH & WELLNESS

The Partnership believes it takes entire communities to create and promote health in Mississippi.

Our Health and Wellness Division had many highlights in 2017 and below are a few we would like to share.



JUST HAVE A BALL

During the 2016 – 2017 school year, with the help of generous sponsors like Trustmark Bank, Just Have a Ball presented to 897 Students across the state and presented each student with a playground ball. To date, Just Have a Ball has presented to:

88 Schools in 32 Counties and a total of 31,489 Pieces of sports equipment given out to deserving youth.



FARM TO SCHOOL

SINCE 2013, THE HEALTH AND WELLNESS DIVISION HAS BEEN ADDRESSING FARM TO SCHOOL ISSUES WITH GRANTS FROM USDA. THROUGH PRODUCE TASTINGS, COOKING DEMONSTRATIONS, RECIPE CONTESTS, HEALTHY INFORMATION SESSIONS AND FARM TO SCHOOL REGIONAL MEETINGS, WE HAVE REACHED OVER 10,000 STUDENTS.



SCHOOL HEALTH COUNCILS

Through the W.K. Kellogg Foundation, the Health and Wellness Division has been assisting with activating school and early childhood centers health councils in targeted areas in Mississippi. The project has affected over 18,000 students and 1,500 teachers, council members, board members and administrators. The program has helped create healthier environments that encourage the consumption of healthy foods an beverages; provide appropriate healthy education strategies; encouraged regular physical activity; strengthen community and family engagement and empower staff to become healthy role models for
